Blue Theology Summer Youth Program

Since 2008, The Christian Church of Pacific Grove has hosted over 50 church youth groups, college and university groups, church intergenerational groups, and clergy on sabbaticals. Deborah Streeter, a minister in the UCC, coined the phrase "Blue Theology" for theological exploration that addresses specific ocean and coastline issues
